

Non-Sequitur: An Answer to Guevara

The Article is an answer to the legal exposition created by ex-judge Guillermo B. Guevara in his Article, “The Law on Plural Crimes”. The Author notes that while the application to the Huk (*Hukbo Ng Bayan Laban Sa Mga Hapon* or The People’s Army of the Liberation Against the Japanese) rebellion, complexed with other common crimes is a “juridical heresy”, the argument presented by Guevara is of a sophistic nature, known as *non-sequitur*. In this Article, the Author notes that there has been no founding connection presented for stating that rebellion cannot be complexed with murder.
