- (1) FRANCIS X. BUSCH'S GUILTY OR NOT GUILTY (1952). The Book is a narrative account of four criminal trials that have made a prime impact in the administration of justice through trial by jury in the United States of America. The Book narrates the captivating drama surrounding these cases, from the filing of charges against the suspect, all up to the conviction of the accused. This though-provoking account of these cases is recommended as a great and interesting reading material.
- (2) WILLIAM SEAGLE'S MEN OF LAW FROM HAMMURABI TO HOLMES (1952). The Book is an account of some of the great men of law. Each subject is given a brief biography, and accompanying it is a vivid picture of the conditions and times in which these men lived, which inevitably played a part in the kind of law that they espoused, formed and helped form. The Book is recommended not only for the law student and legal historian, but to the general reader interested in the lives of these great men.
